The Goal of Project Lifesaver is to save lives – by locating missing persons who suffer from Alzheimer's Diseases, Autism Spectrum Disorder, or persons with Developmental Disabilities or other high risk wanderers. Project Lifesaver has a proven record in over 1900 searches nationally. It is a reliable, effective tool for locating individuals. It offers peace of mind to caregivers.

Individuals enrolled in the program wear a personalized wristband that emits a silent tracking signal every second, 24 hours a day. When caregivers notify Law Enforcement that the person is missing, the Sheriff's Department's specially trained officers respond and search using a mobile tracking system. The average search and rescue time is less than 30 minutes.
